The Youth Ambassadors' General representatives are Sudan Parke (Pearl of the Orient Philippine Pavilion) and Nicolas Tamayo (Pearl of the Orient Philippine Pavilion). Sudan Parke – 2022 Youth Ambassador General

Bio: Sudan is a 17-year-old high school student of both Filipino and Jamaican descent who is currently in her graduating year at Gordon Bell High School. To watch a performance live and see the performers right in front of you, to have the smell of food freshly cooked– I know these things aren't much, but after all this time isolated from the world – it's the little things that matter."

Nicholas Tamayo – 2022 Youth Ambassador General

Bio:

His involvement with Folklorama and the Pearl of the Orient Philippines Pavilion began even before he was born, as his mother was a dancer for Magdaragat Philippines Inc. while he was still in her belly! The entire Galera Family has been active members of the Pearl of the Orient Philippines Pavilion since 2014 through performing and coordinating. Sarahdelle is passionate about inspiring other women of colour to find their own path into leadership.

Quote: "We have missed Folklorama and it gives our family such a connection to our heritage. We need to have Folklorama happen again to create that community of diversity inclusion so that we can embrace empathy."

Karman Sidhu – 2022 Adult Ambassador General

Bio: Karman is an Accounting and Marketing student at the University of Manitoba. After moving to Canada at the age of 6, Karman's parents knew that it was important for him to connect to his culture and language. He began taking part in Bhangra (traditional Punjabi folk dancing), and eventually became a performer at the India Pavilion and Punjab Pavilion. In 2014, Karman became the Youth Male Ambassador for the Punjab Pavilion, and you may have even seen him acting as Emcee for their shows.

Quote: "Covid has impacted our communities throughout the Folklorama family. Without the Festival, they are unable to meet their budgets. I'm so excited about this opportunity."

The Ambassador General program started in 1990 with Aidan O'Brien and Sandra Brown achieving the titles. The Youth Ambassador General program commenced the following year with Jason Epp and Elaine Halabus accepting the honour.
