### Folklorama Announces 2022 Mark & Dorothy Danzker Scholarship for Excellence Recipients

WINNIPEG, MB – August 29, 2022 – Today, Folklorama announced the eight recipients of the Mark & Dorothy Danzker Scholarship for Excellence, an annual award for students who demonstrate a commitment to the preservation of ethno-cultural heritage. The \$1,000 award is granted to eight students aged 17 to 25 pursuing post-secondary studies. Recipients are selected based on GPA, demonstration of active involvement in preserving cultural heritage through volunteer work or employment, and dedication to volunteer work in a cultural activity in the greater community.
